The Council

Community Councils were established under the Local Government Act 1972 and replaced the previous system of Parish Councils. There are over 730 Town & Community Councils in Wales, with over 8,000 Councillors.

The administrative area of Caerwys Town Council reaches the village of Afonwen, part of Babell, Pen Y Cefn and Caerwys Town itself. The population of the area is 1,007 (January 2023 Register of Electors).

During the reporting year Council meetings were held remotely from April 2022, whereafter from September meetings were held hybrid in the Memorial Institute and since January 2023 - the face to face venue being the Llys Y Goron Community Meeting Room, in Holywell Road, Caerwys.

Council meetings are held on the third Tuesday of the month (no meetings held in August and December) and commence at 7.00pm. Non-scheduled meetings can be held in an emergency or possibly in relation to an urgent planning application – especially during the months of December and August. All meetings will be publicly advertised.

The agenda for the meetings are advertised locally including the Council's web site a few days prior to the meeting. Residents of the community and press are welcome to attend all meetings. Residents are also able to address the Council Members for a reasonable period of time at the commencement of the meeting on matters appertaining to the community.

Should any resident, or press member wish to connect to a meeting by audio, please advise the Clerk to the Council by providing at least three days notice prior to the meeting date.

During the reporting year there were no complaints made against the Council, to either the Flintshire Standards Committee or the Wales Public Services Ombudsman

Councillors

Council's objectives (2022 / 2023)

During this reporting year the key objectives of the Council were: (Update in italics)

- ✤ To continue with the environmental projects. (on-going)
- * To continue to enhance the Town Square and surrounding areas. (on-going)
- To further discuss with Flintshire County Highways improvements to the Town Square road surface. Town & Community Councillor Steve Copple has held site meetings with County Highway Officers. Awaiting an improvement plan.
- The completion of the project to install pavements and other road safety improvements for pedestrians, together with the slowing of traffic on the B5122 road through the Town. Completed.
- To fund weekly outdoor activity sessions for the youth of the Town on a trial basis with Aura Leisure (Flintshire County Council). If successful, to consider an annual service level agreement. The activity was held during the reporting year, awaiting costings for year 2023 / 2024
- Multi Use Games Area: Match funding with Aura Leisure (Flintshire County Council) for repairs / upgrade, at a cost of £3,945.00. Due for completion by Flintshire County Council in May 2023.

- To re-issue Work Orders to Flintshire Street Lighting (not completed due to the pandemic) for BS7671 street lantern inspections at a cost of £1,616.00 / removal of a wooden box from lantern pole in Town Square £80.45. Work Orders re-issued, not completed by the County.
- To set up a sub-committee with a remit to enhance the Christmas lighting in the Town Square and immediate area. Sub-committee recommended purchase of additional Christmas lights in the Town Square area; new lights purchased for display in North & South Streets and Memorial Institute. The lights were in situ for the 2022 Christmas period.
- Ear-marked funds towards the provision of: Town Mayor's name board; projector and screen equipment; IT courses and purchase of equipment for use by the community. Town Mayor's Name Board on display on the Council's web site. Funds held in Council's 2023 / 2024 ear-marked reserves for audio visual equipment AV Equipment
- ♦ <u>Additional:</u>
 - (i) During this reporting year the Council agreed to commission a Wooden Harp, to display same on a plinth with bench seating and trees under the Queen's Green Canopy UK project. The Harp has been commissioned, bench seat purchased and two trees temporarily planted – which will be re-sited once the project is completed together with a Queen's Green Canopy Plaque.

Financial

<u>Asset Register</u>

The value of the Town Council's asset register totals £88,768.00. A copy of the register can be obtained from the Clerk to the Council.

Council budget

The Caerwys Town Council precept for the financial year 2022 / 2023 was £39,100.00. This amount is precept on residential properties within the community, and equates to a figure of £58.33p per household on a Band D property. There were 670 Band D household properties within the Caerwys Community area – as at January 2022. The Band D household precept for the Caerwys Town Council area, is made up as follows:

£1,449.58 – Flintshire County Council

£316.80 – Police & Crime Commissioner

£58.33 – Caerwys Town Council

The Caerwys Town Council precept for the financial year 2023 / 2024 is £41,250.00

Financial Assistance

Each year, Caerwys Town Council considers requests for financial assistance to support the work of its local groups, organisations and charities. Grants are specifically made by the Council in the interest of its local area and its residents. The Council allocates grants for financial assistance from the annual precept, in accordance with Section 137 (Local Government Act 1972) and other National and Wales Government Acts.

During the reporting year the Town Council granted a number of applications for financial assistance, which totalled: £2,525.00 under Section 137 and £4,530.00 under various Local Government Acts.

Members Allowance

Payments (Allowances) to Members of Caerwys Town Council - 2022 / 2023. In accordance with Section 151 of the Local Government Measure 2011, Community and Town Councils must publish within their authority area the remuneration received by their Members by 30th September following the end of the year to which the payment relates. The information must also be sent to the Independent Remuneration Panel for Wales (IRPfW) by the same date.

Caerwys Town Council provided the previous years return prior to the required date to the (IRPfW). 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Publication of audited accounts for the year ended 31 March 2023

Regulation 15(5) of the Accounts and Audit (Wales) Regulations 2014 (as amended) requires that by 30 September 2023, Caerwys Town Council publish its accounting statements for the year ended 31 March 2023 together with any certificate, opinion, or report issued, given or made by the Auditor General.

The Community & Town Councils in Wales – Annual Return for the Year Ended 31 March 2023, will be submitted to Wales Audit following confirmation at the May 2023 Council meeting. Flintshire County Council

In 2014 the Town Council agreed to adopt the following: A Shared Community – Charter between Flintshire County Council and Town & Community Councils in the County. Two Councillors and the Clerk to the Council represent this Council at the County Forum meetings, which are generally held twice a year, together with representatives from all 34 Town & Community Councils in Flintshire. The Flintshire County Council did not arrange meetings during this reporting year.

Planning Applications

The Town Council is not a planning authority and as such does not make final decisions on planning applications; this is the responsibility of Flintshire County Council. However, the Community Council is a statutory consultee and as such receives all planning applications relating to the community. The Town Council do make their respective comments and suggestions on all planning applications, including requesting site meetings.

Street Lighting

The street lighting in the Caerwys Town Council area is administered jointly between the Town Council and Flintshire County Council. Whilst the majority of the street lights on the adopted housing estate roads are the responsibility of Flintshire County Council, the street lighting, generally sited on roadside wooden poles, are the responsibility of the Town Council.
