PROGRESS REPORT ON MATTERS RAISED AT PREVIOUS MEETINGS

The Clerk referred to the following matters from previous Minutes:

- (1) **Caerwys Children's Play Area:** A site meeting held on 24th August with Richard Roberts (County Play Design Officer) at the play area with Councillors Susan Broadawy, Steve Copple and Jayne Morris together with the Clerk. Richard Roberts advised to a number of items of equipment that could be accommodated within the present play area. Following the site meeting the above Councillors received a number of options which were presented to all Council Members at this evening's meeting.

Members agreed the following: (1) The Clerk to advise Richard Roberts as to the Council's preferred additional play area equipment (2) The Clerk to seek the cost of Pickleball permanent line markings within the multi use games area.

- (2) **Post Box (Water Street)** Flintshire County Council (Street Scene) have agreed with the Post Office the re-siting of the Royal Mail Post Box to an area near the bus shelter on the Town Square.
- (3) **Vehicle Speed Activated Sign:** A new replacement Vehicle Speed Activated Sign has been installed on the B5122 road in North Street.
- (4) **Bench Seat:** The Clerk advised that Gwella Leisure had quoted the sum of £375.00 to install the bench seat in memory of former Councillor Helen Priestley in the children's play area. The quotation had been accepted by the Mayor and Deputy and is in situ.

Members agreed the following: Confirmed the acceptance of the quotation.

- (5) **Scottish Power:** The Clerk advised further in relation to the non-receipt of invoices that include VAT – with the monies taken from the Council's bank account by direct debit. The Clerk has been in correspondence and telephone calls over the past three months whereby to force Scottish Power to issue invoices with VAT itemised, the direct debit had been cancelled. Prior to this Scottish Power were provided with seven days notice to resolve the invoice concern but failed to do so – hence the direct debit cancellation. The Clerk advised Scottish Power the direct debit will only be re-set up again if the September invoice is received towards the end of September or early October. Members agreed with the Clerk's actions.

Pending Matter(s):

The Clerk advised that the following matter remains in the pending file:

- Street lighting supply. There had been no further update received from another Community Council who had completed an application to be included in the Government's Procurement Contract.

CLERK'S REPORT

- (a) The Clerk advised Members in relation to the following deposits to the Council's bank account:
 - £16,500.00 - Flintshire County Council: Second precept payment for financial year 2026 / 2027
 - £500.00 - Flintshire County Council (Welsh Government): Public conveniences grant
- (b) Caerwys Christmas Lights – 2026 / 2027

Members agreed the following: The Clerk to advise the Street Lighting Contractor the following dates for the Town Square Tree Christmas lights to be switched on and off:

- Switch on: Week commencing 23rd November 2026
- Switch off: week commencing 4th January 2027

- (c) Caerwys Public Conveniences: To discuss financial aspects

The Clerk provided Members with a chronological report in relation to the public conveniences since this Council entered into a twenty-five year lease with Flintshire County Council in 2014. The Clerk also provided financial information to the current running costs of the building, including, in particular, to the electricity supply contract that is due to cease at the end of October. Members were advised as to quotations from a number of suppliers with a substantial increase from the current three-year contract.

Members agreed the following: (1) The Town Council to cover the financial costs to the running of the public conveniences (2) The Town Council to enter into a contract with E-On for the public conveniences electricity supply and the Clerk is authorised to set up a direct debit payment (3) The Clerk to arrange with the public conveniences Committee as to other financial commitments and to report to Council at the next meeting.

STREETSCENE SCHEDULE (FLINTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL)

The Clerk advised in relation to the following information received and concern reported to StreetScene, since the last Council meeting:

- ❖ E-mail received from Ben Corran newly appointed Street Scene Officer introducing himself and looked forward to working with the Town Council. County & Town Councillor, Steve Copple, together with the Clerk have recently met with Ben and the retiring Street Scene Officer Neil Hickey. Councillor Copple provided further information.
- Observation sent to County Councillor Steve Copple: Concern expressed in relation to the B5122 Road - travelling from Caerwys towards the A55 - past The Tollbar Cottage and in the area just prior to a property named Ffrith y Defaid and between Ffrith Y Garregwen (Clwyd Environmental) - there are hidden dips. The enquiry is seeking as to why there is no signage indicating the hidden dips. Councillor Copple provided further information.

The Clerk provided the following update from Mr. Neil Hickie (StreetScene) Officer

- No update in relation to previously reported concerns had been received from Street Scene.

Members brought the following concerns to the meeting:

- (1) Broken up carriageway: B5122 road – travelling up the hill from Afonwen and between Caerwys View and Llwyn Onn
- (2) Road name signage: Could replacement name plate signs be erected on Holywell Road and North Street
- (3) Large potholes and carriageway broken up: Bottom of Chapel Street – adjacent to side of The Marian and wooden hare. A wheelchair user manoeuvred to allow a vehicle access which resulted in the wheelchair tipping over and the resident fell onto the ground. This was apparently due to one of the potholes
- (4) Gully grating requires attention by re-setting: Holywell Road adjacent to Llys Y Goron senior citizens' bungalows
- (5) Request for additional signage – as follows:
 - (i) Hidden dips on B5122 road: Request for safety signage – travelling out of Caerwys towards the A55 and past The Tollbar Cottage in the area just prior to a property named Ffrith y Defaid and between Ffrith Y Garregwen (Clwyd Environmental) (County Councillor Steve Copple has also reported this concern)
 - (ii) Request for warning signage: Pen Y Cefn Road - Indicating Pedestrians and Horses (as a prior warning to motorists). The roads in the Pen Y Cefn area are narrow in parts together with a number of blind corners

The Clerk advised that the above concerns would be brought to the attention of StreetScene.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT (CLLR STEVE COPPLE)

County Councillor Steve Copple provided Members with the following report:

Main Council

- ❖ County Council: There have been no meetings in August and no reports received
- ❖ Number of comments in relating to the Estyn report within the education department with five areas to be improved
- ❖ A number of articles in the local press, to the proposed closure of Catholic schools in Mold / Saltney areas and the construction of a new facility in Flint area, which has been the subject of a second consultation

Local Issues

- Housing issue resolved for a couple from Afonwen who have successfully moved into Maes y Dre
- Residents in Swan Cottages have had serious issues with a collapsed wall belonging to the Old Court and has caused the lack of access to three sets of gardens and a rodent issue. This is being followed up and has been a concern for many months
- Street lights in Pen y Cefn road have not been completed and the pole base coverings are a trip hazard; this is a problem as the section of the road has not been adopted by FCC - but is still in the hands of the developer until work is done to bring it up to specification
- Requested a meeting with Lee Shone, FCC transport dept, about options for Caerwys Hill, awaiting a date
- Have also sought from Lee Shone in relation to the 20 mph sign at Pen y Cefn road, awaiting an answer
- Chased up the newly appointed StreetScene Officer in relation to blocked gulleys, awaiting an answer.

REPRESENTATIVES' REPORTS (COMMITTEES, LIAISON & MEETINGS ATTENDED)

- (i) Councillor Janet Legget-Jones advised that a meeting of the Caerwys Entertainments Committee will be held in the near future

TO CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING: (CLLR JAYNE MORRIS)

- (A) Purchase & Installation of a Red K6 Telephone Box (To be Sited within Caerwys Conservation Area)

Councillor Jayne Morris referred to the Red Post Box being sited in the area the Town Square and sought the thoughts of Members to a Red K6 Telephone Box being sited either within the Town Square area or the High Street – where the previous phone box was sited many years ago.

Councillor Morris also sought the views of Members to the purchase and installation of a public bike charging / repair station – possibly on the opposite side of Compton House (On The Corner Café building) to the suggested phone box and adjacent to the defibrillator on South Street. Photograph of a similar unit was shown on screen.

Members agreed the following: The Clerk to seek the views of Chris Rees-Jones, the County Conservation Officer.

(B) Refurbishment / Replacement seat on The Marian

Councillor Jayne Morris recollected Members to the dilapidated bench seat sited on the Marian Common at the top of the hill from Afonwen. Photographs of the seat were shown on screen. Councillor Morris suggested the seat should be refurbished.

Members agreed the following: (1) The Clerk to seek the views of Chris Rees-Jones, the County Conservation Officer in relation to the wooden slats being removed and replaced with either durable timbers (Iroko, Cedar, or Sapele) or 100% recycled plastic/composite lumber. To also seek the appropriate colour of the concrete bench edges (2) To await the guidance from the Conservation Officer prior to seeking a quotation.

TO FURTHER DISCUSS: CHRISTMAS LIGHTING DISPLAY(S) (CLLRS JOHN JOHNSON & STEVE COPPLE)

Councillor John Johnson advised Members the only Christmas lighting that was in working condition were the Town Square fixed tree lights together with a small set of battery-operated lights. Councillors John Johnson and Steve Copple recommended that a site meeting be arranged with a professional Christmas lighting Company to seek their advice to enhance the Christmas lighting in the Town Square area.

Members agreed the following: The Clerk to arrange a site meeting with a professional Christmas lighting company.
